PRPD Board of Directors Meeting

March Highlights

Paradise, CA, April 3, 2024 – The Paradise Recreation and Park District (PRPD, District) Board of Directors (Board, BOD) conducted its Regular Monthly Meeting on Wednesday, March 13, 2024, at the Terry Ashe Recreation Center.

The Board authorized the District Manager to complete an agreement with the Governor's Office of Planning and Research for a \$750,000 grant. The grant supports the Neighbor-to-Neighbor program, which aims to fortify and improve community resilience, volunteer participation, and neighborhood connections, while raising awareness for climate action and preparation. This program allows for District-wide and neighborhood scale events in all communities within the District, including Paradise, Magalia, Concow/Yankee Hill, and Butte Creek Canyon. The District will be reaching out to the community to help determine community needs and events.

The Board approved an agreement with CPS HR Consulting to develop a classification and compensation study based on the District's job descriptions. This study will provide information on competitive wages to inform future BOD action.

The Paradise Piranhas Swim Team renewed their agreement with PRPD after Board approval.

Board members reaffirmed and adopted the District Investment Policy, providing for prudent investments of District funds and maximizing the efficiency of District cash management and reporting requirements.

The next Regular Board of Directors Meeting will be held at the Terry Ashe Recreation Center on April 10, 2024, at 6:00 pm.
