PRPD Regular BOD Meeting

November Highlights

Paradise, CA, November 13, 2024 – The Paradise Recreation and Park District (PRPD, District) Board of Directors (Board, BOD) held its Regular Monthly Meeting on Wednesday, November 13, 2024, at the Terry Ashe Recreation Center.

The Paradise Horsemen’s Association (PHA) presented their annual report to the Board, highlighting the year’s events and updates. They noted that the PHA Christmas carol ride will be coming up December 14th.

The Board approved a much needed new pool liner for the Paradise Pool as part of the Consent Agenda, which will assist with preventing water leakage at the Aquatic Park.

The District brought multiple personnel and administrative issues to the Board for guidance, including changes to medical benefits and increased allocation towards them.

Park Supervisor Mark Cobb directed attention to multiple projects completed and in progress throughout the District, noting the holiday decorations in progress at the Terry Ashe Recreation Center in the absence of the Ice Rink.

Staff and the Board bid farewell and thanks to Vice-Chairperson Jen Goodlin, whose 2-year PRPD Director term has come to an end. Goodlin will continue to be Executive Director of the Rebuild Paradise Foundation.

The next Regular Board of Directors Meeting is scheduled for December 11, 2024, at 6:00 pm at the Terry Ashe Recreation Center.
