### Report in Brief

California Code (Gov Code, Title 1 Division 4, Chapter 4, Article 2, 1780) addresses vacancies and remaining board members may make an appointment to fill the reminder of the term. With the vacancy created with the resignation of Director Julie Van Roekel, the Paradise Recreation and Park District (District) solicited the community for candidates to serve the remainder of the term until the next election cycle in December 2022 at which time the successful candidate will be subject to a ballot election for a two year term ending December 2024.

The District posted and distributed notices widely and requested basic information in an application. Upon submittal, Candidates were invited to submit supplemental information (resume, letter of interest, and questionnaire). Board members will then ask questions and start the selection process. The Chair will entertain a motion to nominate a candidate for director, and with a second, the BOD will vote. If the motion passes, then the process will cease. If not, the process will continue, until a nomination is approved. If no candidate is selected, the vacancy will remain open.

The appointed director shall take the oath of office and be seated at the July 14, 2021, meeting (PRC, Section 9302.

Staff provide information on the candidates to Board members and a scoring sheet.

**Recommendation**: Review candidates and appoint a Director to serve the term ending December 2022.

If well thought out and maintained, they can help keep us safer as a community and provide areas for recreation as well spaces to relax and enjoy.
- 2.) I think the most important quality for anyone in a leadership role is to be willing to listen. Ultimately the decision comes down to those in charge, but changes are always more well received when the people affected feel like they had the opportunity to give input. I don't know enough about the board members or staff to really be able to give an honest evaluation of the relationship between them and myself.
- I would hope to an asset to the board, providing insight based on the education I have received and being able to communicate effectively the decisions of the board to the broader community. I really enjoy conversing with people and discussing sometimes contentious issues. I like when people make me reevaluate my positions and hope to be able to articulate my position in such a way that they may reconsider theirs.

1. What motivates you to want to serve on our Board? What interests you the most about our District and do you have any personal connection to the organization?

The District, just like so many others on the Ridge, is working diligently to recover from the devastation caused by the Camp Fire. My home was not destroyed by the fire, but, nonetheless, I deal with it's impacts daily. My first motivation is to work with visionary organizations on projects and programs that will assist in the recovery of the community that has been my home since 1991. I am also motivated by that old school notion of public service. A long time friend and colleague asked me to consider applying for the Board vacancy. I believe that I can be of service, and as such, I am submitting my application.

What interests me the most about the District is what I understand to be an imaginative and enterprising approach to recovering from the fire, and perhaps more importantly, positioning the District to be a trend setting and integral part of the new post disaster community.

As a Town of Paradise staff member since 1991, and an active member of the Ridge community, I have had the pleasure of working with several PRPD staff members on a variety of projects and programs. I have known and worked with past and present Board members.

2. What qualities make for a great Board member? What do you see as the relationship between you and Board members, and staff?

During my tenure with the town, I worked closely with Council members. Qualities that I appreciated were respect for other members of the Council and staff, a willingness to consider all aspects of a situation and the range of solutions related to that situation, represent the views of the community, a commitment to do your homework, and, perhaps most importantly, the desire, ability, and courage to be a visionary.

I believe that the relationship between Board members should be built on mutual respect, a spirit of cooperation, and a commitment to doing what is best for the District and community. The relationship with staff should be much the same. I would add that I believe staff should be encouraged and supported by the Board. While the Board sets policy and staff implements those policies, I would hope that staff is comfortable in bringing a wide range of options to the Board and that the Board would provide a safe place to do so.

3. What role would you play on the Board? Please note skills, connections, resources, expertise, and prior Board leadership experience that you offer and are willing to use on behalf of the organization. What areas will you need to learn the most?

Much of my professional experience was in the field of economic development. Quite often when working with developers and businesses the role becomes one of convener and negotiator. The goal is to get to "YES". Although not a direct comparison, I would like to continue in a role that brings parties together to accomplish the goals of the district and the community.

I have lived in the community since 1991, and during that time I believe that I have been blessed with numerous professional and personal relationships with the business community, several community based organizations, and the community at large. I would continue to build on those relationships and in doing so, hopefully, benefit the District.

My prior Board experience is noted elsewhere in the application. I would add that I am currently on the Board of Directors of the Gold Nugget Museum.

I believe that the area I would need to learn the most would be the Districts budget. Hopefully, my experience with the town's budget will shorten that learning curve.

4. What is your understanding of upcoming challenges and opportunities facing the District?

In short, the challenges are rebuilding and constructing new facilities and programs impacted by the Camp Fire. Navigating the insurance and claims process, adjusting to a decline in revenue, and reprogramming to serve the new Ridge population presents a Herculean challenge for any organization. Those same challenges, if realistically addressed, can present an array of opportunities for both the District and the community.

5. What factors might limit your ability to serve?

I am not exactly sure what you are looking for with this question. If appointed, I believe that I have the time and resources to meet my Board responsibilities.



We recorded geographic coordinates (noted to relocate the plot) and basic information such as data measured, observer, plot type and size. Species composition of the plot was based on vertical structure and physiognomy of the plot including name and dated taxonomic reference of all recorded taxa. FIA plots were done with a two man crew recording all pertinent data with a Dell-Axiom PDR. We were responsible for measurement and remeasurement of plots consisting of a cluster of four sample points, with three of the points located 120' from the central point at 0, 120, and 240 degrees azimuth. Each point in the cluster was surrounded by a 24-foot fixed-radius subplot where trees 5 inches (DBH) and larger were measured. The four subplots totaled almost 1/6 acre. Each subplot contained a 6.8-foot fixed-radius microplot where saplings (from 1" to 4.9" DBH) and seedlings were measured. All four microplots totaled approximately 1/75 acre. The microplots were offset from subplot centers (12.0 feet at an azimuth of 90 degrees) to minimize seedling trampling. Each subplot was surrounded by a a 58.9' fixed-radius macroplot, which was used to include large trees (> 40.0 inches DBH) and mortality.
